Non-Profit Club Tax Reminder

Here's a reminder for the small nonprofit clubs whose annual gross receipts are normally \$50,000 or less. Don't forget to electronically submit Form 990-N (e-postcard) to satisfy their annual reporting requirement to the IRS. If a club fails to file for three consecutive years they are at risk of losing their nonprofit status. The filing deadline is May 15.

In previous years filers went through the Urban Institute to file their 990-N e-postcard. Now, nonprofits must file their e-postcard directly with the IRS. Clubs will be required to set up a user profile if they have not already done so.


Madison County Coin Club
