

**2016 Military Numismatists Scholarship Fund
Supporting the Military Money Seminar at the
2016 American Numismatic Association Summer Seminar
June 25th thru June 30th, 2016 (Session II)
On the Campus of the Colorado College
Colorado Springs, Colorado
United States of America**

Purpose: The purpose of the Military Numismatists Scholarship Fund is to promote, strengthen and grow the military numismatics community by sponsoring individuals to participate in the Military Numismatics Seminar at the American Numismatic Association Summer Seminar. Specifically targeted are newcomers to the hobby, individuals with an established interest but new to the military numismatics community, and advanced military numismatists, who are expected to contribute to the content and overall success of the course.

Basic Course: It will emphasize World War II, plus all series of U.S. military payment certificates. Worldwide war-related emissions by all powers (Allied, Axis, and neutral) will be treated, including those for overrun areas and puppet governments, fighting forces, liberation governments, and post-war occupations. Paper money, bonds, coins, and medals will be covered. Conflicts since WWII will be covered lightly. The segment on MPCs will be about 30% of the course, and will cover all aspects of their production, use, and collection.

Advanced Course: For students who have completed the basic Military Numismatics Course (or have permission of the instructors) an advanced “graduate seminar” style class runs concurrently with the basic class. Advanced course students, in addition to independent study and sharing reenactments with the basic course, will receive intensive instruction in short blocks including identifying and attributing notes and bonds that have no English on them. Students work independently on projects tailored to individual interests while also participating in the special “Fest” reenactments of the class.

Your Instructors: Joseph E. Boling and C. Frederick Schwan, co-authors *World War II Remembered, history in your hands--a numismatic study* and *World War II Military Currency*.

Eligibility: Anyone having a passion for military numismatics is welcome to apply for a scholarship. The selection committee will award scholarships based on information and responses to questions in the application. Inquires and/or applications can be sent to ksfdaf@sbcglobal.net

Past scholarship recipients are welcome to apply again, but will automatically be considered advanced numismatists and will be eligible for only 50% of their tuition reimbursement. Further, past recipients must clearly justify why they should be considered for another scholarship. Preference will be given to “basic course,” first-time applicants. No one shall be awarded more than two scholarships from this program.

Costs Covered: The award of a scholarship carries a maximum value of \$1050 (USD.) \$1050 (you must register by March 31 or **you will pay** an additional \$50) covers tuition which includes the class, a room in Loomis Dormitory (double occupancy) for five nights (Saturday to Thursday), all of your meals, and free airport shuttles picking up and returning Seminar students to the Colorado Springs Airport. Scholarship does not cover transportation to and from Colorado Springs or airport shuttles from/to Denver. Anyone awarded a scholarship will be required to join the ANA at individual expense if not already a member. A one-year basic membership is \$28 with an online magazine.

The information you provide in your application is the ONLY information the reviewers will consider in evaluating applications. Scholarships will not be awarded simply because funding is available. You must submit a quality application to be seriously considered. Don't be afraid to brag about yourself!! This is a highly competitive program. Applications will be judged by an impartial committee. All decisions of the committee will be final.

Recipients are requested to volunteer for service to future scholarship programs and are expected to write at least one report of the experience for publication in a numismatic journal. Award of a scholarship includes the likelihood of publishing your name and some general background information.

Please have applications in the hands of the Freeland by Feb. 27th, 2016. For applicants outside the US requiring invitations for visas, please coordinate your needs with the scholarship chairman early.
