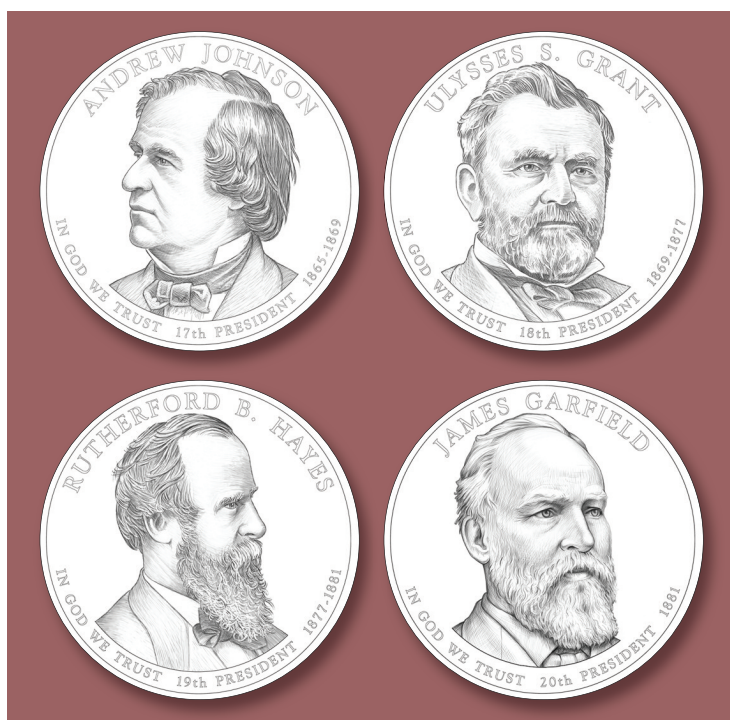




# KNOW YOUR PRESIDENTS

**E**ACH YEAR SINCE 2007, the U.S. Mint has issued four circulating \$1 coins featuring U.S. Presidents in the order they served. The common reverse depicts the Statue of Liberty. Test your knowledge of our 17th through 20th Presidents, who will be honored on dollar coins in 2011: Andrew Johnson (1865-69), Ulysses S. Grant (1869-77), Rutherford B. Hayes (1877-81) and James A. Garfield (1881).

1. His first name was Hiram, but he was always known by his middle name.
2. Of the four Presidents listed above, he is the only one NOT born in Ohio.
3. He is the only U.S. President who also was a lay preacher.
4. His election was decided by a Congressional commission that reviewed contested electoral votes.
5. As a boy, he was apprenticed to a tailor, and he later owned a tailor shop.
6. He was the first President to have a typewriter and telephone in the White House.
7. This President never served as a member of the U.S. Congress.
8. He was shot just four months after he was sworn in as President; he died 80 days later.
9. He earned a degree from Harvard Law School.
10. After leaving the Presidency, he served in the U.S. Senate.
11. Yellowstone became our first National Park while he was President.
12. A professor of classics at Western Reserve Eclectic Institute, he became the school's president.
13. The only U.S. President to be impeached, he was tried by the Senate and acquitted by one vote.
14. He served in Congress for a total of 18 years.
15. He graduated from West Point, fought in the Mexican-American War and was general-in-chief of the Union Army during the Civil War.
16. The first Easter egg roll was held on the White House lawn during his Presidential term.
17. Published after his death, his memoirs became a best-seller.
18. The last U.S. President born in a log cabin, he earned money by driving canal-boat teams.
19. The United States acquired Alaska during his term in office.
20. During the Civil War, his left arm was severely wounded when he was shot by a musket ball.
