## GREEK COINAGE



The earliest Greek coins had images only on one side, most often associated with the patron god of the city or a pun on the city name. As time went on, the images became more varied; first by the addition of a design on the reverse of the coin, then by the addition of legends identifying the issuing city and supporting images that often identified the magistrate responsible for the coinage. The stage was now set for Alexander the Great and the creation of the first integrated Imperial coinage.

## DID YOU KNOW?

The coins of ancient Athens — nicknamed "owls" — had an image of the Goddess Athena on one side and an Owl on the other. Athena — the Greek goddess of wisdom, war, the arts, industry, justice and skill — was the patron goddess and namesake of Athens. Athena was believed to take the form of an owl at times, the root of the modern idea that owls are wise.
