# New eLearning Academy Courses in February

In February, ANA members can expect to see two new courses in the ANA eLearning Academy. One is the fully updated second Numismatic Diploma Program course, *Grading U.S. Coins*. Available completely online and with an introduction from renowned numismatist Kenneth E. Bressett, this course is designed to help collectors evaluate coins. If collectors better understand the factors and current standards that determine a coin's condition and grade, they can study and appraise pieces of their own, independent of grades assigned by third-party services and others.

Aristotle's Vault, a platform where numismatic educators share their knowledge, will release a forum called *Grading United States Coins*. Taught by Don Bonser and Jim Stoutjesdyk, the series will cover a popular course annually presented during Summer Seminar. They examine the qualities and characteristics of coins with the goal of helping students accurately determine a coin's grade from the ANA standards and market grading standards.

Please stay safe and have a wonderful 2025!


